Tools



ScotchBlue™ Painter's Tape for Delicate Surfaces

- Ruler or tape measure

- Sandpaper

- Paints or stains
- Paint brushes
- Pencil


Preparation

For best results, make sure you are working with a square tabletop. (We used a $16" \times 16"$ tabletop). Sand the table and wipe it down to remove all traces of dust. Paint the table with your lighter base color and let it dry for 24 hours. Plan the size and placement of your board to make sure it will fit the tabletop.

Step-By-Step Guide:



Measure 2 inch squares and mark the grid in pencil. Use ScotchBlue™ Painter's Tape for Delicate Surfaces to tape the grid.



Paint the open squares with your darker color following manufacturer instructions. Gently remove the tape, then let the paint dry for 24 hours.



Re-tape your grid, this time placing the tape over the new dark squares. Paint the open squares in between the tape with two coats of the dark color. Gently remove the tape after the final coat.

Additional Ideas


- Create your own checkers! Cut a wooden dowel into pieces of equal width. Paint half of them red and half of them black.
- Paint wooden chairs or stools to match your game board.
- Find a table with a small built-in drawer, so you have a handy place to store your game pieces.
- For best results, always follow the paint manufacturer's instructions regarding recoat and dry times.

Good masking is the key to clean, professional paint lines. ScotchBlue™ Painter's Tapes are specially designed for optimum performance when used correctly. For an extra edge, look for tapes with Edge-Lock™ Paint Line Protector. This advanced technology helps keep paint out and produces super sharp lines for brilliant looks and unlimited ways to transform your space.



- *Once you select a tape, please test compatibility before use, as results may vary.
- 1 Knock-down is a drywall finishing technique in which the surface is mottled with watered-down joint compound
- 2 Orange peel is a bumpy, textured surface resembling that of an orange peel

Tape Tips



Get Extra Sharp Lines Seal your tape edges with a thin layer of base coat paint. This prevents seepage and gives you extra sharp, professional paint lines.



Don't Stretch It
When masking any surface,
pull tape off the roll a few feet
at a time. Avoid stretching the
tape, as this can cause it to lift
up or break.



Seal Tapes Edges
Use a flexible putty knife or
5-in-1 tool to press down the
edges of your tape. This helps
the tape adhere better, so you
can get sharper paint lines.



Score When Removing
Remove tape at a 90-degree
angle. To prevent paint lift, use
a sharp tool to gently "score"
or cut along the tape edge.
