### 4. First-aid Measures

**FIRST AID - EYE CONTACT:** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes holding eyelids open. Get medical attention. Do NOT allow rubbing of eyes or keeping eyes closed.

# 5. Fire-fighting Measures

# 7. Handling and Storage

# 10. Stability and Reactivity

**CONDITIONS TO AVOID:** Flammable hydrogen gas will evolve when product comes in contact with water or damp air. Heat will be generated.
