



POWER UP

1. Insert 3-AA batteries into your Atomic Clock.



CUSTOM DATE DISPLAY

 Press the MODE button to display Counting Seconds or your Indoor Temperature.

SETTINGS

- 1. Hold the MODE button to enter the Settings Menu.
- 2. Use the + or button to adjust and MODE to confirm.

AST = Atlantic EST = Eastern

CST = Central MST = Mountain

HΔT = Hawaii

Settings Menu order:

- Beep ON/OFF
- WWVB ON/OFF
- Time Zone
- DST ON/OFF
- 12/24 Hour Time
- Hour
- Minutes
- Year
- Month
- Date
- Fahrenheit/Celsius

Note: Weekday sets automatically when Year, Month and Date are set.

WWVB ATOMIC TIME SIGNAL

- Hold the PLUS (+) button to start or stop a manual search for the WWVB Atomic Time Signal.
- The WWVB Tower Icon will flash when searching and be solid when signal is received.

ALARM

Set Alarm:

- 1. Hold the ALARM button to enter Alarm Settings.
- 2. Use the + or button to adjust values.
- 3. Press the ALARM button to confirm and move to next item.

Silence a sounding alarm: Press any button except SNOOZE to silence alarm for 24 hours.

Activate/Deactivate Alarm:

- Press the ALARM button once to view alarm time.
- While viewing alarm time, press the ALARM button to deactivate or activate the alarm.

Snooze:

• When the alarm sounds, press the SNOOZE button to silence the alarm for 10 minutes 77 will show next to the Bell Icon

Note: The alarm will sound with increasing frequency for two minutes, then shut off completely if not deactivated.
