



- 2. If possible, always unplug this appliance when not in use.
- 3. Only a qualified service person should repair this product.
- Do not use outdoors.
- 5. Do not cover the cord under the carpeting. Do not cover with throw rugs, runners or the like. Arrange the cord away from traffic areas and where it will not be tripped over.
- 6. To disconnect this appliance, turn the controls to the off position, and then remove the plug from the outlet.
- 7. Connect to properly grounded outlets only.
- 8. This appliance, when installed, must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes or, in the absence of local codes, with the current CSA C22.1 Canadian Electrical Code. For U.S.A. installations, follow local codes and the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA N0.70.

- 10. There is a thermostat limiter inside the heater. When inner temperature overheating or abnormal heating occurs, the thermostat protective device will cut off the power supply to avoid damage to the fireplace or risk of fire.



DANGER: High temperatures may be generated under certain abnormal conditions. Do not partially or fully cover or obstruct the front of this heater.



WARNING: In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the heater.



WARNING: If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.



WARNING: Under no circumstances should this fireplace be modified. Parts that must be removed for servicing must be replaced prior to operating this fireplace again.



WARNING: This appliance is hot when in use. To avoid burns, do not touch hot surfaces with bare skin. If provided, use handles when moving this appliance. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes and curtains at least 3 ft. (0.9 m) from the front of this appliance.


- Install and operate this appliance in accordance with the installation and operating instructions furnished with the





Assembly


Preparing the front panel

- □ Put the Left Front Panel (B) down on a flat surface.
- Insert the Camlock Bolts (DD) into the pre-drilled holes, using the Phillips Screwdriver.
- □ Repeat this process for the Right Front Panel (C).




2 Attaching the front panel

- Insert the Wood Dowels (HH) into the pre-drilled holes in the Left Center Panel (D).
- Align the Left Front Panel (B) and the Left Center Panel (D) and push together.
- To secure into place, insert the Camlocks (EE) into the pre-drilled holes and tighten with the Phillips Screwdriver.
- Repeat this process for the Right Front Panel (C) and Right Center Panel (E).



3 Attaching the center foot

- □ Place the Base Assembly (A) onto a flat surface.
- Insert each Center Foot (0) into the pre-drilled holes on the bottom of the Base Assembly (A).





Preparing the base assembly

- Insert the Camlock Bolts (DD) into the pre-drilled holes in the Base Assembly (A).
- □ Use the Phillips Screwdriver to tighten.

5 Preparing the base assembly


 Insert the Wood Dowels (HH) into the pre-drilled holes in the Base Assembly (A).






6 Attaching the center panels

- Align the Left Center Panel (D) and the Left Front Panel (B) with the Base Assembly (A). Push down.
- Repeat to attach the Right Center Panel (E) and the Right Front Panel (C) to the Base Assembly (A).
- Insert the Wood Dowels (HH) into the pre-drilled holes in the Front Panels (B) and (C).
- Connect the Top Front Panel (F).
- Insert the Camlocks (EE) into the pre-drilled holes in the Center Panels (D) and (E). Turn clockwise to secure.






7 Securing the panels


 To secure the Middle Front Panel (F) to the Left Front Panel (B), insert the Screws (GG) through the Metal Plate (FF) and turn clockwise to tighten.


 Repeat steps to secure the Middle Front Panel (F) to the Right Front Panel (C).



8 Attaching the side panels

- Push the Left Side Panel (H) down onto the Base Assembly (A).
- Insert the Camlocks (EE) into the pre-drilled holes in the Left Side Panel (H). Use the Phillips Screwdriver to tighten.
- □ Repeat step for the Right Side Panel (I).







9 Preparing the top assembly

- Insert the Camlock Bolts (DD) through the pre-drilled holes in the Top Assembly (G).
- Use the Phillips Screwdriver to tighten the Camlock Bolts (DD).

10 Preparing the top assembly


□ Insert the Wood Dowels (HH) into the pre-drilled holes in the Panels (D) (E) (F) (H) (I).






1 1 Attaching the top assembly

- □ Align the Top Panel (G) with the Panels (D) (E) (F) (H) (I).
- Push down to connect.
- Insert the Camlocks (EE) into the pre-drilled holes. Use the Phillips Screwdriver to secure.







12 Attaching the cover

 Peel the back off the Covers (LL) and place over the Camlocks (EE) screwed into the Panels (D) (E) (H) (I).

13 Attaching the back panels

 Insert the Screws (GG) through the pre-drilled holes in the Back Panels (J).






14 Preparing the doors

Put the Left Door (K) on a flat surface.

 Insert the Small Flathead Screws (CC) through the Euro Hinges (BB) to connect to the Left Door (K).

 Apply the Door Bumper (JJ) onto the opposite corners of the Left Door (K).


Repeat for the Right Door (L).

15 Attaching the knobs

- Insert the screws through the pre-drilled holes in the Right Door (L), to attach the Knobs (KK).
- Repeat for the Left Door (K).



16 Attaching the doors

□ Align the Right Door (L) with the Right Side Panel (I).

 Insert the Small Flathead Screws (CC) through the Euro Hinge (BB). Use the Phillips Screwdriver to tighten.




17 Attaching the adjustable shelves

- □ Insert the Shelf Pins (AA) into the pre-drilled holes on the inside of the Panels (D) (E) (H) (I).
- □ Rest the Adjustable Shelves (M) on the Shelf Pins (AA).


18 Installing the fireplace insert into the mantel assembly

- □ Lift the Fireplace Insert (0) carefully into the back of the unit and center in the fireplace insert opening.
- Do not drag the fireplace insert across the Base Assembly (A) as it may scratch your unit.






19 Preparing the securing block




20 Attaching the securing block

- Place the Securing Block (N) onto the Camlock Bolts (DD) and the Wood Dowels (HH).
- Insert the Camlocks (EE) into the pre-drilled holes. Turn clockwise with the Phillips Screwdriver to secure.



21 Leveling the unit

On the bottom side of each foot, are the Levelers (II).
 Turn them until the unit is balanced.



Operation



NOTE: The control panel can be accessed at the upper-right corner of the insert. When a function is changed from the control panel or remote control there will be a corresponding indicator (see Figure 1) on the upper-right of the projection screen. The indicator shows the function changed and the level selected by the control panel or remote control. When the function is turned off, the corresponding indicator will flash several times and then fade off.

1 Powering the fireplace

- Push the Power button to supply power to all functions of the fireplace and put the insert in a standby mode.
- Push the Power button again to turn off all functions.



NOTE: All previous settings are held in memory, so the next time you power up the fireplace, the unit will turn on with the same settings.



NOTE: Holding the Power button on the control panel for 3 seconds will disable the heater function.



? Adjusting the flame

□ There are 6 brightness levels that can be selected:

Settings F6 - F4 decrease in Amber brightness

Settings F3 - F1 decrease in Spectrafire brightness



3 Adjusting the heater

Press the Heater button to set the thermostat. The fireplace contains three infrared quartz heating elements.
 The thermostat setting range is 62°F - 82°F or 17°C - 27°C or always ON.

The thermostat is adjustable by 2°F or 1°C increments. The up and down buttons"—"on the remote will increase / decrease temperature setting.



NOTE: To change between °F and °C press and hold the HEATER button on the control panel for 3 seconds.



Setting the timer

Pressing the Timer button will cycle through the timer settings; 30 minutes, 1 Hour, 2H, 3H, 4H, 5H, 6H, 7H, 8H, 9H and off.



Operation (continued)

5 Replacing the remote control battery

- When the remote control stops operating or its range seems reduced, it is time to replace the battery with new ones.
 - On the back end of the remote, press and slide the battery door open and remove the old battery.
 - Insert 2 AAA batteries, checking that the + and sides of the battery match inside the battery compartment.
 - Replace the battery compartment door.



NOTE: Do not mix old and new batteries. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbonzinc), or rechargeable (nicad, nimh, etc) batteries. Do not ingest batteries.



NOTE: Please operate the remote control at a slow measured pace. Press the remote control buttons with an even motion and gentle pressure. Repeatedly pressing buttons in rapid succession may cause the transmitter to malfunction.



NOTE: Batteries should be removed if the product is to be left unused for a long time.


6 Disposing of used batteries

7 Power cord information

- This heater is for use on 120 volts. The cord has a plug as shown in the figure.
- Connect to properly grounded outlets only.
- Do not use a 2 prong adapter. Never use with an extension cord or relocatable power tap (outlet/ power strip).

Care and Cleaning

- Dust your fireplace regularly with a soft non-lint-producing cloth or household dusting product.
 Clean your fireplace with a gentle non-abrasive household cleaner. Dry your fireplace immediately with a soft cloth or towel.
- □ Tips for using touch-up pen (ZZ): For scratches, stroke in direction of scratch. For worn areas, stroke in direction of wood grain. Rub excess colorant promptly with a soft cloth.
- The motors used on the fan and the flame generator assembly are pre-lubricated for extended bearing life and require no further lubrication. However, we recommend periodic cleaning/vacuuming of the fan/heater.
 Make sure the unit is turned OFF and unplugged whenever you are cleaning the heater or fireplace.



WARNING: Make sure the power is turned off before proceeding with repairs. Any electrical repairs or rewiring of this unit should be carried out by a licensed electrician in accordance with national and local codes. If repairing or replacing any electrical component or wiring, the original wire routing, color coding and securing locations must be followed. During any service of this appliance, the power to the unit must be turned off. First turn the main power switch to the OFF position. Then remove the electrical plug from the wall outlet.



WARNING: Electrical outlet wiring must comply with local building codes and other applicable regulations to reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock and injury to persons.



WARNING: Do not use this fireplace if any part of it has been under water. Immediately call a qualified service technician to inspect the fireplace and replace any part of the electrical system.

Troubleshooting

PROBLEM	ROOT CAUSE	CORRECTIVE ACTION
Display shows "E +"	The thermostat sensor is broken or disconnected.	Unplug the fireplace, remove the back panel of the fireplace and check that the thermostat is plugged into the main circuit board. If this does not solve the problem contact customer service for a replacement thermostat sensor.
Display shows "E 2"	The thermostat sensor is broken.	Contact customer service for a replacement thermostat sensor.
Display shows "E ∃ "	Manual Reset overheat protection has triggered.	Inspect the heater and check that the air inlets and outlets are not blocked as this may cause overheating. Unplug the heater for 30 minutes and allow it to cool down. Replug and operate. Monitor the heater for signs of overheating. If the problem persist discontinue use of the heater and contact customer service.
Display shows "E - "	This is normal operation.	Check your heater cord and plug connections. Faulty wall outlet connections or loose plugs can cause the outlet or plug to overheat. Be sure the plug fits tight in the outlet. Heaters draw more current than small appliances. Overheating of the outlet may occur even if it has not occurred with the use of other appliances. During use check frequently to determine if your plug outlet or faceplate is HOT! If so, discontinue use of the heater and have a qualified electrician check and/or replace the faulty outlet(s).
Heater does not blow warm air.	The heater is in a cool down cycle.	Normal operation will continue to run for several minutes before shutting down. Times will vary based on temperatures. During this time cool air will blow.
There is no power and the logs do not glow.	There is no power to the unit.	Check that the unit is plugged into a standard 120V outlet. Press the Power button several times and make sure power is set to the "ON" position.
The logs glow, but there is no flame effect.	The flame effect turned off.	Press the Flame button several times.
The heater does not blow warm air.	Thermostat setting is preventing the heater from turning on.	Adjust the temperature settings to ensure that the thermostat is set higher than the current room temperature.


Troubleshooting (continued)

PROBLEM	ROOT CAUSE	CORRECTIVE ACTION
Flame effect works but heater function does not and the emberbed flashes when the Heater button is pressed.	The heater is disabled.	With the power on press and hold the POWER button on the control panel for 10 seconds. Once re-enabled the emberbed lights will flash multiple times.
	There are no batteries.	Change the remote batteries.
The remote control is not working.	The signal is poor.	Operate remote transmitter at a slow measured pace. Press the remote control buttons with an even motion and gentle pressure. Repeatedly pressing buttons in rapid succession may cause the transmitter to malfunction.
	The remote is too far from the heater.	Operate the remote at a distance less than 20 ft from the front of the appliance; point the remote at the control panel.
