CEILING VENTILATION FAN

READ AND SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL SAFETY INFORMATION

- 1. Make sure that the electric service supply voltage is AC 110~220V, 50~60Hz.
- 2. Follow all local electrical and safety codes, as well as the Nation Electrical Code (NEC) and the Occupation Safety and Healthy Act (OSHA).
- Always disconnect the power source before working on or near the ventilating fan, motor or junction box.
- Protect the power cord from sharp edges, oil, grease, hot surfaces, chemicals or other objects.
- 5. Do not kink the power cord.
- 6. Do not install the unit where ducts are configured as shown in Fig. A.
- 7. Provide suction parts with proper ventilation.
- This unit is UL listed for use over a bathtub or shower when installed in a GFCI protected branch circuit.
- 9. These ventilating fans are intended for residential usage only.

WARNING

TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE, ELECTRIC SHOCK, OR INJURY TO PERSONS, OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Use this unit only in the manner intended by the manufacturer. If you have any questions, contact the manufacturer.
- Before servicing or cleaning unit, switch power off at service panel and lock the service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- Installation work and electrical wiring must be done by qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable codes and standards, including fire-rated construction.
- 4. Sufficient air is needed for proper combustion and exhausting of gases through the flue (chimney) of fuel burning equipment to prevent back drafting. Follow the heating equipment manufacturer's guideline and safety standards such as those published by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and the American Society for Heating Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) and local code authorities.
- When cutting or drilling into wall or ceiling, do not damage electrical wiring and other hidden utilities.
- 6. Ducted ventilating fan must always be vented to the outdoors.
- 7. Do not install this ventilating fan where air temperature may exceed 40°C (104°F).
- If this unit is to be installed over a tub or shower, it must be marked as appropriate for the application and be connected to a GFCI (Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter) – protected branch circuit.
- 9. These models are UL listed for tub and shower enclosures.
- 10. Do not use this unit with any other solid-state control device. Solid-state controls may cause harmonic distortion, which can cause motor humming noise.
- 11. Before servicing or cleaning unit, switch power off at service panel and lock the service disconnecting means to prevent power from being switched on accidentally. When the service disconnecting means cannot be locked, securely fasten a prominent warning device, such as a tag, to the service panel.
- 12. NEVER place a switch where it can be reached from a tub or shower.
- 13. Not to be installed in a ceiling thermally insulated to a value greater than R40. (This is required for installation in Canada only)



CAUTION

- 1. For general ventilating use only. Do not use to exhaust hazardous or explosive materials and vapors.
- 2. Not for use in cooking area. (Fig. B)
- 3. This product must be properly grounded.

INSTALLATIONS

A.Install with wood frame

1. Body installation

1-1. Construct the wood frame (not provided) with 30mm square bar and attach it to the ceiling joist.

1-2. Attach the duct connector to the wood frame with taping screws.



- 1-3. Insert the body into the wood frame and connect it to the duct connector. Secure the body on wood frame with taping screws.
- 1-4. Follow step 4 to 7 of installation to complete the installation work.



B. Install with joist

1. Choose the installation type according to the figure as below:

Spacing A on Center Joints	Insert Suspension Bracket		
12 inches	Refer to Fig. C-01, D-01, E-01		
16, 19.2 and 24 inches	Refer to Fig. C-02, D-02, E-02		

2. Type I - 12 inches between joists







- 2-1. Insert the suspension bracket I into the bracket cover of adaptor side and select one of suspension bracket $I\!\!I$ and $I\!\!I\!\!I$ of the back of the fan body.
- 2-2. Insert the fan between joists. Make sure the fan body is level and perpendicular with the joist.
- 2-3. Ensure the distance between ceiling and fan body for the thickness of grille.
- 2-4. Secure the suspension bracket to joists by using screw.
- 2-5. Secure the suspension bracket to fan body by using screw.
- 2-6. Follow step 4 to 7 of installation to complete the installation work.

3. Type \mathbf{I} – 16, 19.2 and 24 inches between joists









- 3-1. Insert the suspension bracket ${\rm I\!I}$ into the bracket cover of adaptor side and insert the suspension bracket ${\rm I\!I\!I}$ and ${\rm I\!I\!I}$ into the back of the fan body.
- 3-2. Insert the fan between joists. Make sure the fan body is level and perpendicular with the joist.
- 3-3. Ensure the distance between ceiling and fan body for the thickness of grille.
- 3-4. Secure the suspension bracket to joists by using screw.
- 3-5. Secure the suspension bracket to fan body by using screw.
- 3-6. Follow step 4 to 7 of installation to complete the installation work.

4. Duct connection



4-1. Insert the duct into the duct connector and tape all ductworks connection to make them secure and air tight.

4-2. Install the duct with a gradient 1°~2° to the outside.

5. Connect wiring

- 5-1. Follow all local electrical and safety codes.
- 5-2. NEVER place a switch where can be reached from a tub or shower.
- 5-3. Connect wires as shown in wiring diagrams.



5-4. Using wire nuts, connect house power cable to ventilating fan wires.



5-5. 14 AWG (2.1 mm2) is the smallest conductor that shall be used for branch-circuit wiring.

6. Test run and grille attachment

6-1. When the power on, check for abnormal vibration or sound.

6-2. Insert the mounting springs into the slots and mount the grille to the body.



7. Operation

Humidity Models: VFB25ACH, VFB25ADH, VFB25AEH

Manual operation for humidity control mode & full speed mode. Power on the fan once and fan is in humidity mode. Fan blades will spin or not spin depending on level of humidity in the environment.

7-1 Humidity sensor mode:

- Blue LED indicator lights show humidity sensor mode
- Humidity control automatically turns fan ON when humidity above 60%RH
- Airflow increase with humidity linearly as below picture.
- Saves energy because unit runs only when humidity level is high



7-2. Full speed mode:

- Amber LED indicator lights show full speed mode
- Cycling switch to run full speed mode when you need.

Single Models: VFB25AD, VFB25AC

7-3. Single speed control mode: Turn on the power switch to operate ON or OFF.

Dual Speed Model: VFB25AX

- 7-4. Low speed control mode: Turn on the power switch to operate low speed mode, and LED is green.
- 7-5. High speed control mode: Cycling ON/OFF switch to operate high speed mode, and LED is amber.

MAINTENANCE WARNING

Disconnect power source before working on unit. Routine maintenance must be done every year.

CAUTION:

- 1. Never use gasoline, benzene, thinner or any other such chemicals for cleaning the ventilating fan.
- 2. Do not allow water to enter motor.
- 3. Do not soak resin parts in water over 60°C.

CLEANING

- 1. Pull down the spring to remove grille.
- 2. Wash and clean grille. (Use non-abrasive kitchen detergent, wipe dry with new cloth.)
- 3. Remove dust and dirt from ventilating fan using a vacuum cleaner.
- Using a cloth dampened with kitchen detergent, remove any dirt from ventilating fan. Wipe dry with new cloth.
- 5. Replace grille.
