Important safeguards for you and your new TV

1. Read & Follow Instructions

All safety and operating instructions should be read and followed before the TV is operated.

2. Retain Instructions

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. Heed Warnings

All warnings on the TV and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. Cleaning

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a soft and slightly damp cloth for cleaning.

5. Water and Moisture

Do not use this TV near water, for example, near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

6. Accessories Carts and Stands

Do not place this TV on a slippery or tilted surface, or on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The TV may slide or fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the TV.

7. Transporting the Television

A TV and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the TV and cart combination to overturn.

8. Ventilation

9. Power Sources

10. Power-Cord Protection


11. Lightning

For added protection for the TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV from lightning and power-line surges.

12. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code (U.S.A.), ANSI/ NFPA 70 provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

13. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall on to power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

14. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

15. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this TV through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on or inside the TV.

16. Servicing

Do not attempt to service this TV yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

17. Damage Requiring Service

Unplug from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- **a.** If the power-supply cord or plug is damaged.
- **b.** If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the product.
- **c.** If the TV has been exposed to rain or water.

Upon completion of any service or repairs to this TV, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine whether the product is in proper operating condition.

20. Wall Mounting

21. Heat



• To insert batteries, turn the remote control over and remove the battery cover.




• Place two (2) AAA batteries into the compartment with correct polarity.



• Replace the cover.


- When pointed towards the television, the effective range is approximately 12 feet from the front of the IR receiver, 30° to the left and right, 20° up and down.
- To avoid damage from possible battery chemical leakage, remove the batteries if you do
 not plan to use the remote control handset for an extended period of time. Do not mix batteries of different age and/or type. Always discard used batteries safely.
- Do not expose remote control to liquids, direct sunlight or sources of excessive heat.
- The IR receiver will not work properly if TV is in direct sunlight, the remote control is pointed off-axis or an object is in the IR path.



NOTE: Improper use of batteries can result in a chemical leakage or explosion.


Functions can be controlled using the remote control handset

- **1. Power** Turn the LCD display ON or OFF (Standby).
- **2. Display** Provides program information currently viewed.
- **3. Audio** Select Dynamic, Standard, Movie or User sound modes. (pg.19)
- **4. MTS** Press to select a program's second audio channel (if available). (pg. 19)
- **5. CCD** Select closed caption subtitles (if available) OFF > ON. (pg.22)
- **6. Guide** Press to review scheduled programming for the current channel viewed.
- **7. FAV** Press to display a list of favorite TV channels you have added. (pgs. 26)
- **8. Freeze** Pause and still-frame the current image on the display. Press again for live TV.
- **9. Picture** Select from various preset picture modes: Dynamic > Standard > Movie > Power Saving > Personal.(pg.20)
- **10. Temp** Select the Color Temperature: Cool > Normal > Warm. (pg. 18)
- **11.** ▼▲◀ ▶**Arrows/ Enter** Navigate menus to make selections. Press **ENTER** to confirm.
- **12. Exit** Press to exit a menu that is displayed.
- **13. Return** Press to return to the previous menu displayed.
- **14. Sleep** Press to activate the Sleep function to turn off the TV automatically; OFF > 5 Min > 10 Min > 15 Min > 30 Min > 45 Min > 60 Min > 90 Min > 120 Min > 180 Min > 240 Min > OFF
- **15. Menu** Press to display the Main menu.
- **16.Zoom** Select viewable Wide > Zoom > Cinema > Normal. (pg. 27)
- **17. Volume (+/-)** Adjust volume up (+) or volume down (-).
- **18. Last** Press to select between the current and previously viewed TV channel.
- **19. Mute** Press to temporarily turn sound off. Press again to resume.
- **20. Channel** \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown scan channels up (\blacktriangle) or channels down (\blacktriangledown).
- **21. Numbers** / **Dash** Select desired TV channel directly. For example: to select digital channel four, press "4" "-" "1" (4-1).
- **22. Input** Press to display all input sources on screen. (pgs. 11-14)






1. Input - After connecting your DVD, cable box, etc., select the appropriate input source to view. Press the INPUT button to display input options. Press **CH+** / **CH-** buttons to highlight an input. Press **VOL+** to select.



- **2. Menu** Press the MENU button to display. Press **VOL+** to select from the 6 menu options available to you. Press **CH+** / **CH-** buttons to select a feature from the selected menu then press **VOL+** / **VOL-** to adjust settings.
- **3. Channel (CH+ / CH-)** Press the **CH+ / CH-** buttons to select a channel in TV mode.
- **4. Volume (VOL+ / VOL-)** Press the **VOL+ / VOL-** buttons to adjust volume up or down.
- **5. Power** Press the POWER button to turn the LCD display ON/ OFF (standby). When the power is on, the blue LED illuminates. The screen image will appear within a few seconds.




Wall Mounting

It is recommended that you call your local TV dealer or a licensed contractor to secure the television to the wall using a suitable VESA 75 x 75 wall mount hardware.

Removal of TV Pedestal for Wall Mounting

To remove the pedestal base from the television, unscrew the (4) Philips head screws and remove the entire assembly.



- 1. DC 12V IN Connect only to included 12V Power supply
- 2. SERVICE Port For service technician use only.
- **3. HDMI Inputs (2) -** Connects to digital AV equipment that feature HDMI connectivity. HDMI supports enhanced high definition video and up to 7.1-channel digital audio all from one cable. Recommended for best performance. HDMI cable not included.
- **4. PC IN VGA Input -** Connect an optional VGA cable (not included) from your personal computer .

PC Audio Input (3.5mm) - 3.5mm audio cable (not included) for sound.

5. Component Y Pb Pr Input - Connect to an AV device that features component (Y Pb Pr) video and audio output jacks.

6. RF Input - Connect an antenna or cable connection for television reception.

Note: Use an outdoor antenna, cable or satellite for best reception.

- **7. Headphone Jack -** Connect a stereo headphone (3.5mm not included) for private listening.
- **8. SPDIF** Connect an optional coaxial digital cable (not included) through a compatible amp/receiver to enjoy superior audio sound.
- **9. AV Input -** Connect an external device to the composite VIDEO (V) and AUDIO (L/R) output jacks found on most video equipment.





- Connect the yellow video cable from the video output jack on your external A/V equipment (ie: DVD player, set top box) to AV input on the TV's rear panel.
- Connect the white/red audio cables for sound from the audio (L/R) output jacks on your external equipment (ie: DVD Player, set top box) to the AV (L/R) jacks on the TV's rear panel.

How to Use

- Press the AV button on the remote control or
- Press the INPUT button on the remote control. Use ▼▲ arrow buttons to high-light the input to view (AV) then press ENTER.



How to Navigate:

- Press the ▲ ▼ arrow button to highlight the item you want.
- NOTE: 1. TV reception when using an indoor/outdoor antenna is dependent on local terrain, tall buildings and distance from local area TV transmission towers.
 - 2. The Channel Access Codes are different for ATSC and cable .

Select antenna options and perform Channel Auto Scan to receive television channels that will be stored into the TV tuner memory.

To enter TV Mode:

- Press the MENU button
- Using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons; scroll to highlight TV mode
- Press the down ▼ arrow button to highlight CABLE or AIR

Select **CABLE** if you subscribe to a pay television service without a set top box.

- Using the ◀ ▶ arrow button to highlight CABLE.
- Press the ▼ arrow button to select AUTO SCAN. Press ENTER and the cursor will move up and CABLE SYSTEM will be displayed next.
- Press the ► arrow button to select STD > IRC > HRC > Auto (Auto is recommended).
- Press the down ▼ arrow button to select Auto Scan and press
 ENTER.
- Channel Auto Scan may take several minutes to complete.

Select **AIR** when connected to an indoor/outdoor antenna.

- Press the down ▼ arrow button to select Auto Scan then press the ► right arrow button twice to start Channel Auto Scan.
- Channel Auto Scan may take several minutes to complete.



NOTE: For cable or satellite users without an indoor/ outdoor TV antenna, there is no need to run Channel Auto Scan. Connect your cable or satellite set top box to one of the available inputs on the TV for viewing. See pages 11-13 for connection details.


The **PICTURE** menu offers options to enhance and refine the picture displayed on your TV based on ambient room light and personal preferences. Adjustment options include contrast, brightness, color, sharpness and color temperature.

How to Navigate:

Press the **MENU** button on the remote control. Navigate using ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to select **PICTURE**. Press the down ▼ arrow button to highlight **PICTURE MODE**, then press the ▶ arrow button to select your viewing preference from 4 factory options: **STANDARD > DYNAMIC > MOVIE > POWER SAVING * > PERSONAL**. The STANDARD setting is recommended for most viewing environments. Depending on the ambient light level in the room, you may find one of the other options more pleasing.

To make more critical adjustments based on your own preferences in PERSONAL:

- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight Contrast. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to increase or decrease contrast intensity.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Brightness**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to increase or decrease overall brightness.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Color**. Navigate using the
- ◆ arrow buttons to increase or decrease color intensity.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Tint**. Navigate using the
 arrow buttons to adjust colors toward green or reddish tint.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Sharpness**. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to soften or view crisper edges in the picture.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight your **Color Mode** preference. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to select COOL (more bluish tone), NORMAL or WARM setting.



Note: When adjustments are complete, you may select another menu by pressing the Menu button.

^{*}The **POWER SAVING** mode adjusts the brightness of the TV in order to save energy and reduce power consumption.

The **AUDIO** menu offers options to make sound enhancements while listening through the built-in speakers or to select digital audio options when connected to a Dolby Digital receiver though a (SPDIF) coaxial digital output.



- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight Bass. Navigate using the
- ◆ arrow buttons to increase or decrease low frequency intensity.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight **Treble**. Navigate using the
- ◆ arrow buttons to increase or decrease high frequency intensity.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight Balance. Navigate using the
- ◆ arrow buttons to adjust sound towards the left or right speaker.
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight Surround. Press the ► arrow button to turn the dimensional surround effect ON or OFF (for built-in speakers only).
- Press down ▼ arrow button to highlight SPDIF type. Navigate using the ◀ ▶ arrow buttons to select between PCM (Analog Audio) > RAW (Digital Audio). See page 15.






