
CAUTION: This Reclining Adirondack is NOT a TOY.

· Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




· Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-






Assembly Steps



This Reclining Adirondack has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Reclining Adirondack parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.






Place the Seat Panel with Footrest(A) onto a clean, non-marring surface.


- **2.1)** Remove pre-fixed holding bars of the Footrest that are inside Seat Panel by using Screwdriver(⑦)
- 2.2) Pull the Footress out of the Seat Panel as indicated by the arrow.


Note: Please keep the screws and holding bars and put aside for Step 8



Attach Support Bar of Front Leg(E) to Left Front Leg(C) and Right Front Leg(D) using Screws() with Screwdriver().

Step 4





Place the Backrest(B) onto Seat Panel(A) as shown in the picture.


- **5.1)** Secure Support Bar of Left Armrest(H) to Backrest(B) using Short Screw() with Allen Key().
- **5.2)** Secure Support Bar of Deft Armrest(H) to Seat Panel(A) using Bolts(), and Sleeve Nuts() with Allen Keys().

Do not fully tighten Bolts and Screws.


Repeat the same process with the Support Bar of Right Armrest(I).

Step 6






Position housing of Recliner(K) into oval mortise of Backrest(B).
Secure Recliner(K) to Backrest(B) using Long Screws(③) with Allen Key(⑥) **Do not fully tighten the Screws.**



Attach Right Armrest(G) to Left Front Leg(C) and Support Bar of Left Armrest(H) using Bolts(), and Sleeve Nuts() with Allen Keys(). **Do not fully tighten the Bolts.**2

Repeat the same process with Left Armrest(F).



Reattach holding bars and screws from Step 2 to Footrest using Screwdriver().

The holding tars are to prevent the Footrest from falling out of the Seat Panel.

In a sequential manner, tighten all Bolts and Screws at all joints until fully locked into position.

Step 9 OPEN STORE

Your Reclining Adirondack is ready for use.

This Adirondack can only be used on a flat, level surface.

The Footrest can be stored under the Seat Panel when not in use.

To Open, by hand, pull the Footrest outward and unfold the Footrest's Leg **To Store,** by hand, fold the Footrest's Leg and push Footrest into under the Seat Panel

Care & Maintenance



Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface



Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



 To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor prodcts, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.



Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 is a California law that requires warning labels on products that may contain one of more than 800-plus chemicals or ingredients that the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) has deemed to cause cancer or other reproductive toxicity. Chemicals and elements on this list include wood dust, brass, and other everyday substances, which can be found in very common household items, such as: lamps, tableware, jewelry, crystal glasses, electric cords, beauty products, automobiles, and furniture

Why Did I Find a Proposition 65 Warning on My Home Goods Product?

We include Proposition 65 warnings on all of our products because there is always a chance that one of the 800plus common chemicals and ingredients listed under this law could potentially be on our furniture or packing materials. We risk large fines under this law, if we don't include this warning.

Should I worry?

We realize you may be worried finding this warning on our products, but we want to reassure you that the hazardous exposure limits for any of these chemicals have never been found on furniture products that we've shipped to our customers. Additionally, this warning label is very common and can be found on almost every piece of furniture sold in the state of California.
