

PLEASE RETAIN THIS INFORMATION FOR YOUR FUTURE REFERENCE

OPERATING INSTRUCTION:

- Insert 3 AA batteries (not included) into battery compartment on the back of unit.
- Press the "ON/OFF" button to turn on LED Lights & sound and for SOUND SENSOR and LIGHT SENSOR operation. Make a loud noise or simple walk front to activate the item. Note: Light sensors activate best in well-lighted places. And press it again to turn it off.
- The "TRY-ME" is intended for in-store demonstration only. Please remove "TRY-ME" wire and insert batteries into battery compartment during normal operation.
- Remove battery if product is left unused for a long time.

BATTERY INSTALLATION:

- Locate battery compartment on the back of unit.
- Remove compartment door using a small Phillips screw driver (screw driver not included).
- Place 3 new AA batteries (batteries not included) into the compartment matching the polarity of the batteries to the markings in the compartment.
- Replace battery compartment door and hand tighten screw to hold door in place.

CAUTION:

- Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc) or rechargeable (ni-cad, ni-mh, etc.) batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Replace all batteries of a set at the same time.
- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.
- Ensure the batteries are installed correctly with regard to polarity (+ and -).
- Remove batteries from equipment which is not to be used for an extended period of time.
- Remove used batteries promptly.
- Batteries should only be changed under adult supervision.
- Do not dispose of batteries in fire, batteries may explode or leak.
- Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the product.
- Batteries are harmful if swallowed, so keep away from young children.
